Note on comparing postsecondary enrollment rates between THECB and SFP: Percentages of in-state enrollment for THECB data reflect enrollment on the 12th class day; percentages of in-state enrollment for the SFP, based on StudentTracker data from NSC, include any enrollment in the fall following graduation. Not all schools in Texas participate in the National Student Clearinghouse and so in-state postsecondary enrollment rates at the THECB may be higher than those using NSC data. The THECB uses enrollment data based on the 12th class day, and so SFP postsecondary enrollment rates, based on enrollment during the fall semester rather than on the 12th class day, may be higher than those provided by the THECB.

DEFINITIONS AND TECHNICAL NOTES:

THECB Statistics – In-state college enrollment statistics for the fall semester immediately following high school graduation are published by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board each year; data sources used include PEIMS reports of high school graduates obtained from the Texas Education Agency linked to college enrollment reported by in-state colleges and universities on the 12th class day of enrollment. Student Futures Project Statistics – In-state and out-of-state enrollment for the entire fall semester immediately following high school graduation as computed by the University of Texas Ray Marshall Center Central Texas Student Futures Project; data sources used include PEIMS reports of high school graduates obtained from participating school districts linked to college enrollment as measured by the StudentTracker service from the National Student Clearinghouse (NSC).

Differences in the in-state rates of college enrollment between the Student Futures Project and the THECB can occur for the following reasons:

1. Not all Texas colleges are included in the NSC database for the time period being measured. (See list below.)
2. THECB measures fall enrollment on the 12th day of class while NSC includes enrollment for the entire fall.
